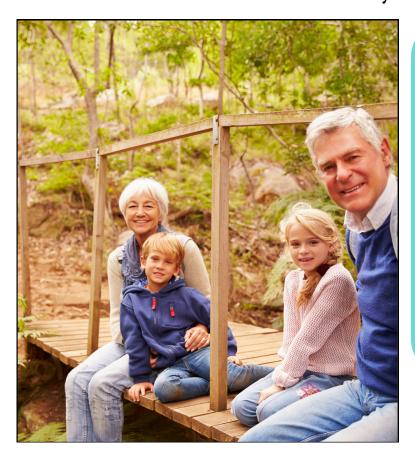

FROM CRISP LEAVES TO COZY MEALS: SIMPLE AUTUMN COOKING IDEAS

Fall is a wonderful time to try new and healthy meals. As the weather cools, those favorite autumn foods can add a warm and comforting touch to the changing season. Meal planning with a little advanced meal prep can add a variety of seasonal vegetables and fruits and support our goal of eating to nourish our body.

In the fall, there are many tasty and healthy foods to choose from. Apples, pumpkins, sweet potatoes, and squash come into season. These foods are delicious, and they are also full of energy, vitamins and minerals, and fiber. Shopping for t he season saves money and adds variety to our diet. Simple meal prep can start with just one or two meals a week. For example, you can cook a big pot of soup or chili on the weekend. Then you'll have easy lunches or dinners ready to go. Roasting vegetables like carrots, sweet potatoes, and broccoli is another smart and quick idea. Once cooked, they can be added to salads, wraps, or grain bowls throughout the week.

Making extra food when you do cook can help for future meals. For example, if you bake chicken or cook rice, make enough for a few meals. Store the leftovers in containers in the fridge or freezer so they are ready when you need them. Don't forget to research for great ways to store leftover produce from the garden as well. Freezing, canning, and drying vegetables, herbs and fruits are all ways to extend fresh produce into the colder months.

Fall is also a perfect time to enjoy warm drinks like herbal tea or hot apple cider to help you stay hydrated. Partner with a snack like a fresh apple and peanut butter or a whole grain muffin for a healthy snack in the afternoon.

Small changes can lead to lasting habits that will stay with you throughout the year!



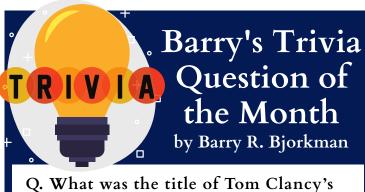
Roasted Maple Glazed Sweet Potatoes and Apples

Ingredients:

- 2 large, sweet potatoes, peeled and
- 2 apples, chopped (leave the peel on for extra fiber)
- 2 tablespoons of olive oil
- 2 tablespoons pure maple syrup
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon

Instructions:

- Preheat your oven to 400°F.
 In a large bowl, mix the sweet potatoes and apples with olive oil, maple syrup, and cinnamon.
- Spread the mixture on a baking sheet in a single layer.
- Roast for 25–30 minutes, stirring halfway through, until the sweet potatoes are soft and the apples are golden.
- Serve warm as a side dish or enjoy as a healthy snack.
